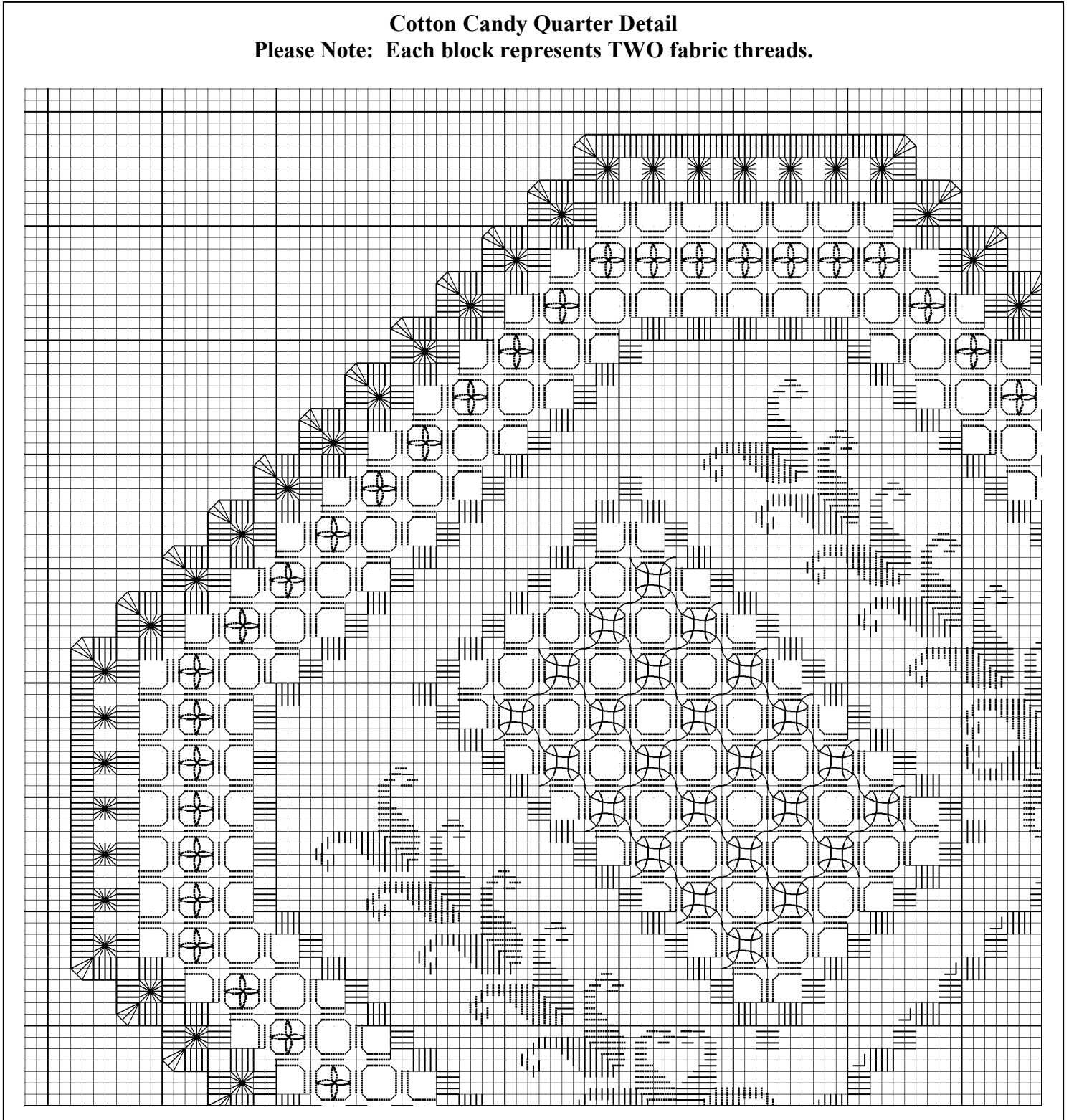

Please Note: Each block represents TWO fabric threads.

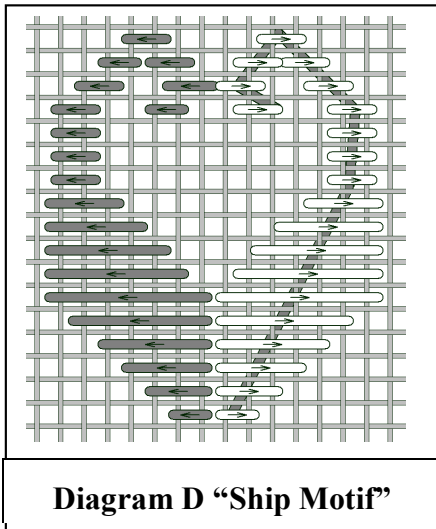
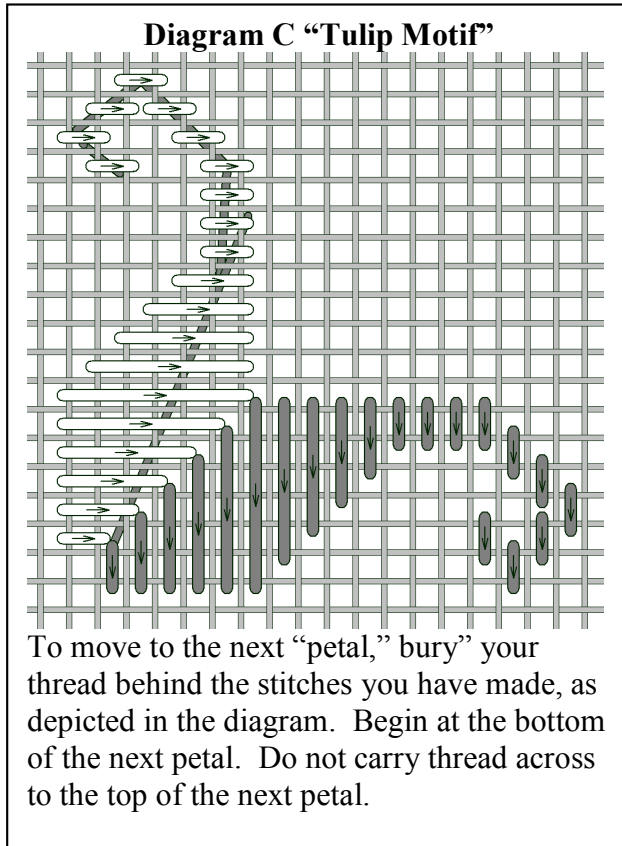
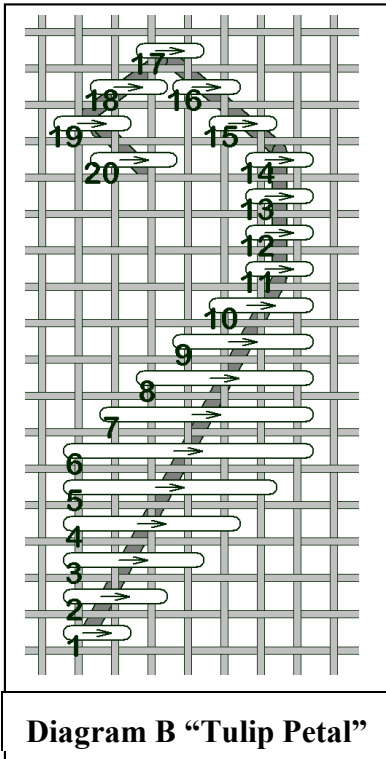

Ships and Tulips and Rosettes

Next you will stitch the Tulips and Rosettes. If you look carefully at the rosette, you will see that it is made up of Tulips on the diagonal...or if you look at it squarely, it appears to be made up of Ships. Each of these motifs is composed of the same basic unit (see Diagram B). How they are put together, or their orientation in regard to the grain of the fabric, determines which type of motif you will end up with. See Diagrams C and D for Tulip and Ship motifs, and Diagram E for the Rosette. To begin the first Rosette, count down 28 threads from the center of your first Kloster and stitch the petal according to Diagram B. Repeat for all four sides. For Tulips, place according to main chart (or quarter detail) and stitch according to Diagram C.

Be very careful when stitching the rosettes to count carefully. You may want to practice this on a doodle cloth.
